

Sir Charles Woollcombe's Family Scroll of 1877

Sir Charles Woollcombe's Family Scroll of 1877 is perhaps the most extraordinary artefact in the Woollcombe Family Archive. It is extraordinary for several reasons:

- 1. It goes back to 1170 further than any other document we have found;
- 2. It is hand-written and hand-painted on a 1m wide 10m long sheet of paper;
- 3. The original was burned when Ashbury House burned down in 1877. The 20-year old Charles set to immediately to re-make it, probably better than before.
- 4. He could do this because, by lucky chance, he'd taken the original papers and coats of arms away from Ashbury to his house two days before.[see History]





WOOLACOMBE IN THE DOMESDAY BOOK

Woolacombe was recorded in the Domesday Book as Wolnecoma, literally meaning "Wolves Valley." At the time, the valley was presumably covered in thick woods where wolves could be found. It had a recorded population of 20 households in 1086, listed under 2 owners: William the Goat – and – Theobald son of Berner. The page on the right is a scan of the actual Domesday book and the Wolnecoma entry is expanded below with the mediaeval text translated and transcribed into modern text:

WOOLCOMBE IN THE DOMESDAY BOOK

Woolcombe was recorded in the Domesday Book in the Hundred of Yetminster in the country of Dorset. It had a recorded population of 15 households in 1086, under the ownership of William Eu (see below.) It remains and is one of many Woolcombe or Wolcombe farms, Woods and Villages in the West Country.






The biography of a visionary whose life and work exemplifies and reflects that period of Canada's history.

It is the story of an Englishman who came to Canada with the high-minded ambition to educate new generations of citizens with the values of service and effort.

On September 16, 1891, G. P. Woollcombe began teaching 17 boys in an upstairs room on Wellington Street, directly across from the Parliament Buildings. Over his next 42 years as headmaster, Ashbury College became part of the fabric of the emerging nation.








In 1807 Britain declared war on the slave trade, and a small fleet of Royal Navy ships formed the frontline


the early nours of 1 February 1829
the Spanish slawer El Alminante turned
to face the Royal Navy ship that had
been pursuing it doggedly for the past
31 hours. Bigger than its opponent
and carrying 14 guns as opposed to the
British ship's single 18-pounder, the Spanish
vessel had every chance of righting its way to

El Almirante hung in the balance, as HMS Black Joke closed in under unusually calm weather conditions, resorting to oars to get within range of its prey.

A short, fleroe firefight broke out, and over the course of 80 minutes El Almirante suffered 28 casualities, including the death of its captain. The Spanish ship had become another victim of one of the West Africa Squadron's most effective ships, which was somewhat ironic – the Black Joke had started life as a slaver, and its speed had originally been intended to evade the British vessels aiming to stamp out the slave trade.

Abolition and war

Britain's decision to abolish slavery has been described as "the most expensive
